Dear Chair Murkowski and Cassidy and Ranking Member Cantwell and Heinrich

The Access Fund, American Alpine Club, American Whitewater, El Sendero Backcountry Ski and Snowshoe Club, Evergreen Mountain Bike Alliance, The Mountaineers, Washington Climbers Coalition and Washington Trails Association — all human-powered recreation organizations in Washington State — come together as a coalition on issues relating to recreation, access and conservation. As Washington Outdoor Alliance, we represent more than 35,000 members who recreate on public lands. We write to express support for the Mountains to Sound Greenway National Heritage Area Act, as introduced into U.S. Congress by Senator Maria Cantwell in June, 2015, which seeks to establish the Mountains to Sound Greenway National Heritage Area in the State of Washington.

The Mountains to Sound Greenway is an outdoor paradise stretching from the Seattle to Ellensburg. It includes 1,600 miles of trails, excellent whitewater runs, backcountry skiing and snowshoeing, rock climbing routes, and mountain biking opportunities. The Greenway is accessed by members of all of our organizations to enjoy these activities, and is an important driver of Washington's recreation economy.

National Heritage Area designation would help the different land agencies in the area better collaborate on management – from trail maintenance to trailhead parking and educational resources. This would have a significant positive impact for this area that is experiencing increasing popularity and use. Designation would also promote local economic growth from tourism and outdoor recreation, and provides a flexible strategy to encourage residents, government agencies, nonprofit groups and private partners to collaboratively plan and implement projects to preserve a landscape, without affecting private property rights.

In spring of 2015, more than 3,100 of our members signed a petition in support of National Heritage Designation.

In short, the Mountains to Sound Greenway is integral to outdoor recreation in the Pacific Northwest and we support National Heritage Area designation to help protect this resource. Sincerely,
