In Washington state alone, **nearly 7,500** state residents have signed letters calling for permanent reauthorization and full, dedicated funding for LWCF and urging Congress to act before the program expires on Sunday. With hundreds of LWCF-protected sites and landscapes in every corner of the state, Washingtonians know the value this incredibly popular program brings to their communities.
