On behalf of the undersigned organizations and individuals, the No Child Left Inside Coalition extends our sincere thanks for your investment in connecting underserved youth to nature through the No Child Left Inside (NCLI) grant program in the 2021-23 operating budget. NCLI supports critical outdoor educational programs in rural and urban communities across the state, helping students to experience the natural world in myriad life-changing ways. The \$4.5 million in funding for the program will support 65% of funding requests received this year, serving more than 116,000 youth. Public funding will be matched by more than \$6.4 million in private dollars and contributions that leverage this critical state investment.

As we work together to recover from the COVID pandemic, funding for this program will provide invaluable opportunities for youth to come together, reconnect, and experience the healing powers of nature. The \$4.5 million in state funding for NCLI is a down payment for future leaders, innovators, and advocates of our communities.
