Re: Requesting operating budget support for No Child Left Inside grant program

Dear Budget Leaders:

On behalf of the 75 undersigned organizations¹, the No Child Left Inside Coalition is writing to thank you for your strong support for connecting youth to nature through outdoor educational programs in your respective operating budget proposals. As we work together to recover from the COVID pandemic, funding for this program would provide critical opportunities for primarily underserved youth across the state to come together, reconnect, and experience the healing powers of nature. We specifically request your support for the No Child Left Inside grant program at the \$4.5 million level as you work toward a final operating budget.

Revitalized in 2015 by the Governor's Blue Ribbon Task Force on Parks and Outdoor Recreation, No Child Left Inside is now a signature program that connects underserved youth and families to the outdoors across the state. Since 2015, the program has served more than 50,000 youth, creating an incredible legacy of learning and connection with nature, and has been replicated in other states including California, Minnesota, Hawaii, New Mexico, and Nevada. In Washington, the program has served a wide diversity of populations based on geography, socioeconomics, race, ethnicity, and ability across the state and the public funding has been matched by private funds dollar for dollar. In the 2019-2021 grant cycle, the Recreation and Conservation Office received over \$8 million in grant applications for \$1.5 million in available funds; in 2021-23, the program has received nearly \$7 million in grant

requests. This demand demonstrates the need across Washington and showcases the public's interest and engagement in this popular program.

The 2021-23 operating budget proposals currently include an additional \$4.5 million in the Senate budget and \$500,000 in the House budget for No Child Left Inside, funded through Washington State Parks (the grant program is administered through the Recreation and Conservation Office). We respectfully request that you fund No Child Left Inside at the Senate's proposed level, providing an additional \$4.5 million in your final operating budget, which would provide a total of \$6 million in funding for the program for the next biennium. Funding No Child Left Inside at this level would allow the program to serve more than 85 percent of current grant applications, providing transformational experiences to more than 153,000 youth across Washington and facilitating nearly 8,000,000 hours of much-needed outdoor activity. In addition, the state grant dollars would be matched by more than \$8.6 million in outside funding. On average, 61 percent of youth benefitting from this year's grant applicants are eligible for free and reduced lunch, 53 percent are youth of color, and 19 percent are youth with disabilities. These programs serve rural and urban communities across the state and provide immeasurable benefits that are needed now more than ever.

With your help, we can provide more children with the opportunities to connect to nature and make a critical contribution to the state's recovery from the pandemic. The No Child Left Inside grant program can open access to outdoor educational programming that can change lives for tens of thousands of Washington's youth. We know that these kinds of programs improve test scores and can ignite a lifelong connection to the environment.

Please make a sound and smart investment for the future of Washington's children by increasing the state's investment in No Child Left Inside. This is a down payment for the future leaders, innovators, and advocates of our communities across the state. Thank you for your leadership and commitment to connecting children to Washington's great outdoors.
