1. Member of mountaineers
2. Basic graduate or equivalency
3. Climbing committee approval

B. FIRST YEAR REQUIREMENTS

1. MOFA First-Aid certificate
2. Complete all intermediate lectures
3. Complete all intermediate field trips

C. REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION

1. Participate in two basic field trips - one rock oriented and one snow oriented
2. Lead one club climb
3. Participate in three technical rock climbs
4. Participate in two technical ice climbs
5. Participate in three winter climbs, one overnight
6. Maintain a current MOFA card
7. Petition the climbing committee for graduation

EVERETT MAY HOST RUSSIAN GUESTS

The Everett Mountaineers may have the opportunity to show the beauty of the Cascade and Olympic Mountains to young visitors from the USSR, if a vision of the Holy-earth Foundation and the Everett Mountaineers comes to reality.

Everett Chairman Jim Eychaner recently met Danaan Parry, founder and director of Holyearth. Danaan has arranged many "citizen ambassador" visits to the USSR. In these visits, American citizens meet and work with Soviet people on a one-to-one basis; the visits promote individual understanding and acceptance, an important step in the process of establishing world peace.

Danaan wants to bring young people from the USSR to the US sometime in the spring or summer of 1986. The young people would visit Washington D.C., California, and Washington State. Danaan is planning a November trip to Moscow to negotiate with the Soviet government.
