Chairs are appointed by the branch chairman. The chair is always a volunteer—and has to be a woman or man who is willing to give the energy and dedication needed to get a sometimes frustrating job done.

If you want to serve on an existing committee, want to chair one, or want to see a new one formed to take care of a club need — just ASK. It's easy. And it can be fun — and definitely rewarding.




