## Alpine Travel Report

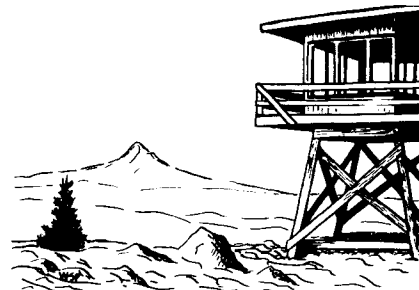
