HELEN FELDER






Three Fingers Lookout Project



More information on the Everett mileage award Patch.

Everett Mountaineer Members can qualify for the Everett Mountaineers Mileage Award by meeting the following conditions.

- 1. All eligible trips (hiking, scrambling, backpacking, climbing, backcountry skiing and snowshoeing) must be done after Sept. 1, 1985. All personal logs for awards must be submitted to the Mileage Award Coordinator by Oct. 1 of each year for presentation of awards at the annual Awards Banquet in Nov.
- 2. Each trip must be 3 or more, carry 10 essentials.
- 3. Mountaineer trips or private trips qualify if 2 or more are Mountaineer members.
- 4. Trip discriptions must be recorded on the application for award.
- 5. Mountaineer members participating in Mountaineer couses can use those miles.
- 6. Children less that 14 yrs old whose parents are Mountaineers can qualify.
- 7. A patch will be awarded for a minimum of 100 miles traveled.
- 8. Additional awards for 200, 400, 600, 800 and 1000 miles. Pins will be awarded at every 1000 miles.
- 9. To apply the application form must be filled out. These can be obtained at Everett Mountaineer Meetings or from Larry Longley, Mileage Award Coordinator, 6010 52nd Ave. N.E., Marysville, Wa. 98270.
