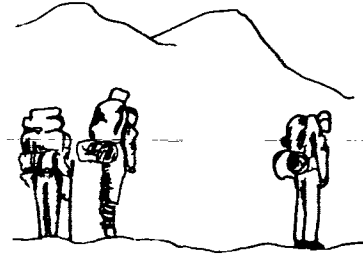
EXPLORER SCOUT PROGRAM
