#### LOOKOUT PEAKS AWARD

The Lookout Peak Award is presented to Mountaineers who climb any 12 of the following 19 peaks. In order to receive the award, the applicant must petition the Hiking Awards Committee listing: 1) Peaks climbed, 2) Dates, and 3) Members of the party (party should be minimum of 3, at least one other a Mountaineer). Any previous Lookout Peaks climbed before October 1987 can be counted. Those peaks are: Mt. Pilchuck, trail route before September 1978, Mt. Pilchuck via Pinnacle Lake and Lichtenberg Mt. before October 1987.

The original list comprised of peaks which offered wide vistas and the summits were reached by a trail or no technical climbing equipment was needed. The extended list includes peaks which have or have had lookouts and are reached by a trail. In expanding the list, participants have a wider selection of peaks. At the same time, the wider choice should lessen our impact on Wilderness areas.

Anderson Butte, 5420 ft., (USGS Lake Shannon), 8 miles, 1800 ft. elevation gain.

Church Mt., 6315 ft., (USGS Mt. Baker), 8-1/2 miles, 5400 ft. elevation gain.

Mt. David, 7431 ft., (USGS Wenatchee Lake), 16 miles, 5200 ft. elevation gain.

Mt. Dickerman, 5732 ft., (USGS Bedal), 8-1/2 miles, 3800 ft. elevation gain.

Green Mt., 6500 ft., (USGS Downey Mt.), 8 miles, 3000 ft. elevation gain.

Hidden Lake Peak, 6890 ft., (USGS

Eldorado Peak and Sonny Boy Lakes), 8 miles, 3500 ft. elevation gain.

Mt. Higgins, 5142 ft., (USGS Oso), 10-1/2 miles, 3200 ft. elevation gain.

Huckleberry Mt., 5355 ft., (USGS Huckleberry Mt.), 7 miles, 4800 ft. elevation gain.

Mt. Pilchuck, either route, 5324 ft., (USGS Granite Falls), 4 miles, 2100 ft. elevation gain.

Rock Mt., 6852 ft., (USGS Wenatchee Lake), 8 miles, 3400 ft. elevation gain.

Sauk Mt., 5537 ft., (USGS Lake Shannon & Rockport), 4 miles, 1138 ft. elevation gain.

Mt. Si, 4167 ft., (USGS Mt. Si, North Bend, & Bandera), 8 miles, 3200 ft. elevation gain.

Sourdough Mt., 5985 ft., (USGS Diablo Dam & Ross Dam), 7 miles, 3900 ft. elevation gain.

Surprise Mt., 6330 ft., (USGS Scenic), 15 miles, 4100 ft. elevation gain.

Park Butte, 5450 ft., (USGS Mt. Baker & Hamilton), 7 miles, 2250 ft. elevation gain.

Dock Butte, 5210 ft., (USGS Hamilton), 4 miles, 1700 ft. elevation gain.

Winchester Mt., 6521 ft., (USGS Mt. Shuksan), 9 miles, 3000 ft. elevation gain.

Alpine Lookout, 6200 ft., (USGS Wenatchee Lake & Labyrinth Mt.), 10-1/2 miles, 1700 ft. elevation gain.

Lookout Mt., 5719 ft., (USGS Marblemount), 8-1/2 miles, 4500 ft. elevation gain.

Mt.Townsends, USGS Tyler Peak, 9 miles, 3,500 Ft. Take Edmonds ferry.
