## **SNOWFLAKES**

Skiing season is not over yet. You may just need to go a little higher to find good snow. Do beware of spring avalanches as the snow pack changes and warms. Some of the best skiing can be at this time of year in the high country, and frequently there are fewer skiers as people put away their skis for the season and get out hiking boots and gardening tools.

We do advise that you be wary of spring hazards such as tree wells (as attested to by a certain ski committee member who will remain nameless, whose initials are S.D.). Also be alert for fast flowing streams hidden under the snow, weakening snow bridges and creating dangerous caverns and holes. Hypothermia remains a threat, but bring along plenty of sun screen and good UV reflecting glasses to protect you from the sun, even on cloudy days.
