SNOWFLAKES

It has come to our attention that King Snow Snake has sent word to King Shutterbug expressing the Snow Snake People's dismay at Snow World being shown as dull or gloomy in slides taken by some skiing shutterbugs. This vexation undoubtedly contributes to the frequency of Snow Snake attacks upon skiers in general and skiing shutterbugs in particular. Having one ski undermined and collapsing while one takes a sip of water is annoying, but to have a camera buried in the process is simply ...unacceptable.

This feud goes back in time so far that we may never know whether the dumpings were in revenge for the dull slides or the dull slides were in revenge for the dumpings.

King Shutterbug, being tired of lens plants. suggests that skiing shutterbugs might have less trouble with these rascals if we took better pictures of Snow World.

King Shutterbug reminds us that our light meters always tell us what exposure to use to render our subject as medium toned. This is fine as long as our subject is a normal scene with green grass, gray rocks, blue sky, etc. However, if our subject is lighter or darker than normal, we have to compensate by over or under exposing respectively. In the case of Snow World - snow being considerably lighter than a normal scene - we must over expose our pictures to make them look bright. King Shutterbug suggests a 1 to 1 1/2 stop over exposure. If you want to fine-tune your slides so that they have both brightness and detail in the snow, try over exposing in half stop increments up to 2 1/2 stops. Record the meter reading, compensation you made and frame number. When you get your slides back, determine which slide you like best. Then check your notes to see what you did to get that slide.

Maybe, if we all follow King Shutterbug's advise, King Snow Snake will feel that we really do appreaciate the beauty of Snow World and instruct his War Lords not to attack skiing shutterbugs.

However, even if we are able to change our ways and modify the behavior of our automatic cameras, that we have spent a weeks to a months wages on, we still must be careful of these rascals because they will have great difficulty in determining who is a Sking Shutterbug, let alone who is taking good pictures of Snow World.


