# **HIKING**

July 29-July 1, Saturday through Monday. Stien River Trail, lower Stien Wilderness area near Lytton, British Columbia; Stein River topo 92-I/5. Approximately 30 miles round trip, 1500' gain. Joint trip with Mountaineer Photo Group and Sierra Club of W. Canada. Backpack along wild, pristine Stein River from near confluence with the Fraser to Cottonwood Creek. Largest wilderness watersheds in SW B.C. with one of the largest virgin forest ecosystems in south B.C. Magnificent scenery- waterfalls, whitewater, ancient forests, lush rock gardens wildlife and pictographs. Bears (Black and Grizzley) are abundant, but present no threat to the careful hiker. 103 Hikes in SW B.C., p. 176.

### **CLUB HOUSE**

During February, 1991 Larry Longley invited various members to serve on a Club House Feasibility Study Committee. This Committee has Forest Clark as Chairman, Dennis Miller as Vice-Chairman and George Swan as Reporting Secretary.

This twelve-person committee has met three times. The purpose of this Committee is to evaluate the needs of our members with regard to the possibility of having our own clubhouse.

The Committee has identified a number of areas of concern, including the following:

Our Branch is steadily increasing its membership.

A stand alone facility does not appear possible because of the expense involved in operating it.

There is general agreement among the members of this Committee on the need to share a facility, possibly with other groups interested in outdoor recreation. This raises the major concern - What type of facility would best serve the needs of our members?

There is a master plan at the Everett Parks and Recreation Department that identifies user needs and facilities available to them.
