## HIKING

July 29-July 1, Saturday through Monday. Stien River Trail, lower Stien Wilderness area near Lytton, British Columbia; Stein River topo 92-I/5. Approximately 30 miles round trip, 1500' gain. Joint trip with Mountaineer Photo Group and Sierra Club of W. Canada. Backpack along wild, pristine Stein River from near confluence with the Fraser to Cottonwood Creek. Largest wilderness watersheds in SW B.C. with one of the largest virgin forest ecosystems in south B.C. Magnificent scenery—waterfalls, white-water, ancient forests, lush rock gardens wildlife and pictographs. Bears (Black and Grizzly) are abundant, but present no threat to the careful hiker. 103 Hikes in SW B.C., p. 176.
