MILEAGE AWARDS

Everett Mountaineers can qualify for the Everett Mountaineers Mileage Award by meeting the following conditions:

- 1. All eligible trips (including: hiking, scrambling, backpacking, climbing, backcountry skiing, and snowshoeing) must be done after September 1, 1985. All personal logs for awards must be submitted to the Mileage Award Coordinator by October 1 of each year for presentation of awards at he Annual Awards Banquet in November.
- 2. Three or more persons must travel together and each must carry adequate equipment and the ten essentials.
- 3. Mountaineers or private trips will qualify. At least one other Mountaineer will be a member of the group.
- 4. On all trips, Mountaineer or private, the date, area, destination, trail and road name or number, type of trip, miles traveled, name of leader, and name of two companions must be entered on the Award Application Log.
- 5. Mountaineer students participating in Mountaineer courses can use course trips to qualify for the award.
- 6. Children less than 14 years of age whose parents are Mountaineer members may qualify for the award, if they meet all other conditions.
- 7. A patch will be awarded for a minimum of 100 miles traveled—on or off trail.
- 8. Additional mileage patches will be awarded for 200, 400, 600, 800, and 1000 miles. Thereafter, a patch will be awarded in 500 mile increments. In addition, pins will be awarded at every 1000 miles.
