LOOK OUT AND TRAIL MAINTENANCE.

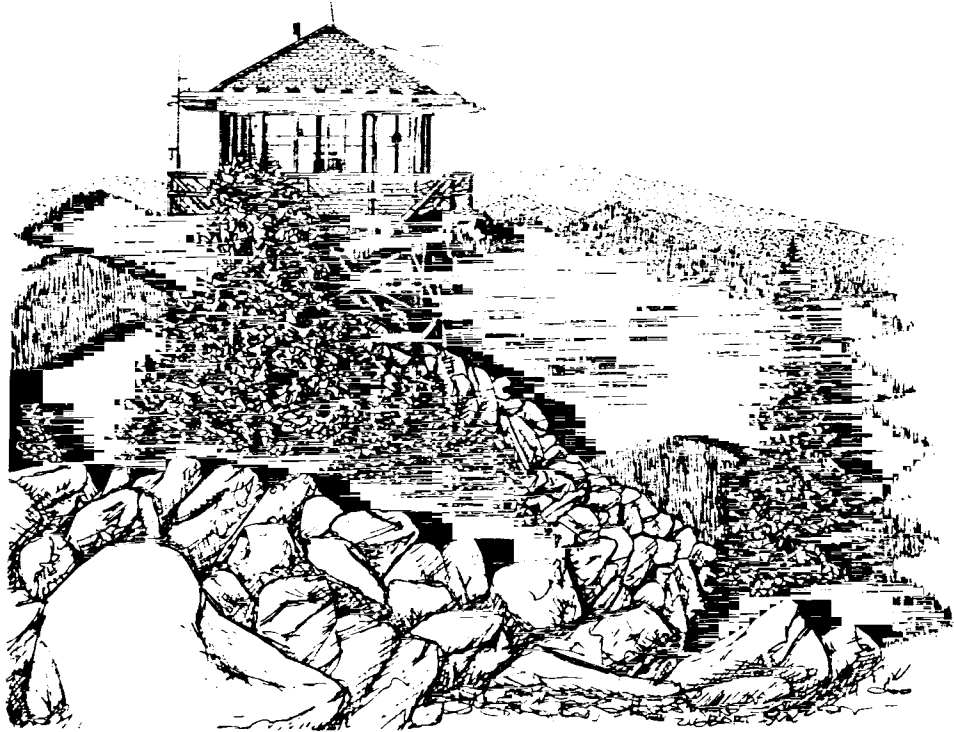

Aug 17-18, Pilchuck Lookout. Workparty will do minor repairs and paint lookout floors. Trail is 2.5 miles and has 2200' elevation gain. Contact Linda Nyman (789-0987) for details.

September 21- 22, Silver Lake. Trail work and meadow restoration on the banks of silver Lake above town of Monte Cristo.

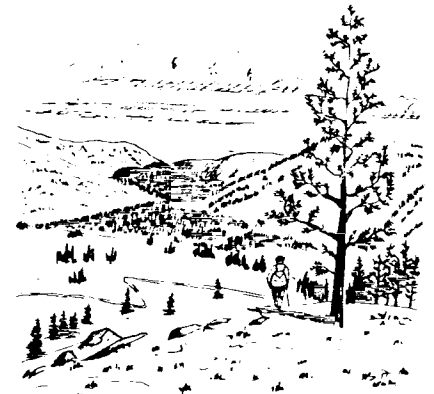

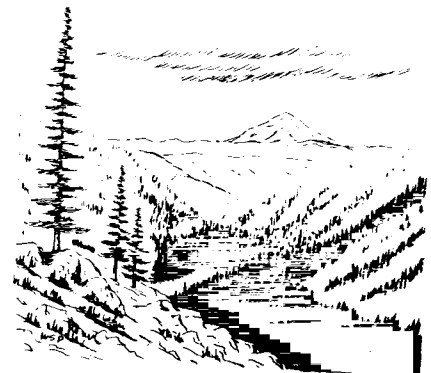
