Everett Branch Historical Trivia

The Everett Branch of The Mountaineers has always been a very active and innovative group. Since organized in 1910, many changes have taken place - some still in use today, some lost and forgotten to all but a few.

In the next few issues of the Newsletter, I would like to share some "Everett Branch Historical Trivia" with the members. The following "Historical Trivia" is taken from the October 1946 meeting of the Everett Mountaineers:

The Everett Mountaineers met at the home of Casey and Lolita Jones with Harold Sievers as Chairman. A new pin award was decided upon and named the "Valley Pounders." It was to be awarded to climbers who climbed any 12 of 15 peaks which were to be determined by a committee. The Branch also authorized the purchase of one or two climbing ropes for use by members. The Climbing Chairman was to be in charge of the equipment. A fee of 15 cents was charged each guest to cover the cost of refreshments for the meeting.
