


This bit of trivia is taken from the April 7, 1954 minutes of the Everett Mountaineers with Philip Zalesky as chairman.

A discussion concerning climbing ropes was held, with the point made that the group needs at least four or five manila ropes. A motion to purchase two nylon ropes failed. A second motion was made to purchase two manila ropes was amended to four or five manila ropes; the comparative virtues of nylon verses manila ropes resulted in the amendment being defeated and the main motion resulting in a tie. A committee was appointed to report at the next meeting.

The Seattle Board of Trustees proposed a change in the title of the head of the Everett and Tacoma Mountaineers. It was suggested they be named "Director". Herman Felder made the motion that our trustee be instructed to inform Seattle that the Everett group wants the title, "President" for its executive.

A climbing fee was set at 25 cents for all climbs, instead of the usual 10 cent trail fee.



### TRUSTEES REPORT

I have been working on a committee to make recommendations for a Mountaineer guest policy. Recently, there was a proposal by the Board executive committee to only allow members to take courses. The branches felt that this would seriously impair some of their programs, since the nonmembers are a source of revenue and new members. At the May Board meeting these concerns were raised. The Board seemed to be very sensitive to the branch concerns, and decided that each division and branch be allowed to decide this issue.

The Sierra Club has filed a suit against the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service to compel the Service to conduct an objective review of the status of the northern spotted owl. This would hopefully lead to the listing of the owl as a threatened and endangered species, and future protection of the old growth forests in which they live. The Board voted to have the Mountaineers join the lawsuit, and contribute \$500 to the costs.

The Board approved a new Seattle Climbing Committee peak pin. The Cascade Classics Pin will be awarded for climbing 18 out of 20 of the highest nonvolcanic peaks in the state.
