TRAIL HAINTENANCE

Good news! We are going back to work on our adopted trail to our beloved Three Fingers Lookout! We did a fine job of repairing that trail last year, and the Forest Service is glad to have us continue with the section from Saddle Lake to Goat Flats.

We are planning to fix mud holes beyond the lake. The idea is to cut nearby logs (about 6" to 8" diameter) long enough to span the mud holes, put two of them side by side across the mud, then flatten the tops with adzes. There are 3 or 4 such places, plus a section around a meadow that appears to require mainly grading and fill. The Forest Service will supply us lifting tongs and all other tools (you climbers who know how to do rigging might use your skills for the job).

It be nice if enough people turn out so that we can assign two or three independent crews to work on different sections of the trail. Please plan to do your part on Saturday, August 27. Mark your calendar now, and give this trail maintenance trip your top priority for that day. The satisfaction of spending a day in constructive effort is worth it.

Please sign up with Gordon Rogers, 353-2085, not later than Thursday, August 25, so the required number of tools can be ordered from the Forest Service.

We will car pool from the Everett PUD at 7:00 a.m. Bring a lunch and work gloves.


WELCOME NEW MEMBERS

TELEMARK SKI CLASS



The telemark ski class is an introduction to cross-country downhill technique. The class will emphasize the use of the telemark turn on more difficult terrain with nordic ski equipment. Fundamentals of avalanche safety will also be covered. Lectures: Nov. 10 and 17. 7-10 p.m., classroom: Everett Swallows' Nest. Field Trip: Dec. 3, Stevens Pass, Practice with avalanche transceivers. Ski Field Trips: Dec. 7, Jan 11 and 18, 6:30-9:30 p.m., local ski area. Jan 28 and 29, The Mountaineers Mt. Baker Lodge.

II. Enrollment

Must be a member of The Mountaineers at time of application. Course fee: \$15. Lift tickets and Mt. Baker Lodge fees are additional. Description should contain: previous experience(trips completed, type and terrain); downhill skiing experience; winter camping experience; training in avalanche safety; current status of MOFA training; brief statement of your goals in the class.

III. Graduation

Complete lectures and field trips, current MOFA card, master the telemark turn, lead a basic nordic ski tour or demonstrate leadership ability, complete two moderate or advanced ski tours. Complete these requirements in two years.

Casey Jones, Trustee, said the club was interested in buying or leasing a site in the Mt. Pilchuck Ski Area. A site is available at Cedar Flats in the newly created Mt. Pilchuck State Park. The Board suggested a representative from Everett be appointed to investigate the ski area and to report to the Board by spring.

Membership Chairman Adelsa Doph reported the new adult membership is now \$9.00 and the junior membership is \$5.00. These amounts include the initiation fee, annual dues and the annual. Everett membership on this date is 88.

Salmon Bake, 1953:
Total receipts were \$39.75 which included
75 adults at 50 cents each and 9 children
at 25 cents each. Total expenses for
salmon, potatoes and misc. items were
\$29.75, leaving a balance of \$10. 54
Everett Mountaineers attended and 30
Seattle members. Herman Felder was the
chairman. Also helping were: Adelsa and
Bill Doph, Frank Eder, Vi Johnson, Lee
Hirman, Helen Felder and others. (Editor's
note: Where were Dorothy and Steve Philipp?
Oh, they joined the Mountaineers in 1956!)
