Mt. Pilchuck Lookout

On April 29th, a group of twelve members hiked up through the snow and enjoyed a spectacular view on a warm sunny day while shoveling out the winter accumulation of snow and ice that had built up within the lookout. Every one had a great time and made short order of the work with so many hands pitching in

We received a \$200 donation from R.E.I. and Scott Paper has indicated their intention to donate \$1000 to our project. The Mountaineers Foundation has agreed to pay the bill on typesetting and photoduplication for our

The windows and door are now finished except for installing the glass. We would like to thank Forrest Clark for his efforts in arranging for the door and windows to be built and for securing a donation of the one quarter inch tempered glass. We are currently working on building the shutters and displays that will go in the lookout. Kevin Broderick did an outstanding job of designing our lookout displays. Stan Kostka and Steve Keiffer will be constructing the displays, as well as overseeing most of the actual construction end of the project.

We are still in need of pictures of the lookout. We have several from the twenties and thirties, but would be interested in seeing more, and we need pictures of the forties, fifties and sixties. Even pictures of the old ski area would interest us. If you have any pictures we would appreciate borrowing them to make a duplicate copy for our displays.

Cascade Senior High School is conducting a raffle to raise money to donate to us for our lookout project. They hope to sell 5000 tickets at \$1.00 each and donate a potion to our restoration. The remainder will go toward a Mt. Pilchuck Lookout display at their school.

Prizes will include a Sony Walkman, Sony 13" Color TV, Pioneer Car Stereo, Sharp C.D. player, Sony cordless phone, Panasonic answering machine, concert tickets, sporting goods, gift certificates and other small prizes.
