Hi Everett Mountaineers,



Upcoming Courses

Nordic (Cross Country) Skiing | Jan 4 - Feb 4

Unlock a world of winter fun and exploration. This course is designed for beginners, but more experienced skiers are also welcome to join us to improve their techniques and make new skiing partners. Contact Rachel Sadri at everettnordicski@gmail.com for information about enrolling at the first class on Jan 5.

This popular entry level course will get you on your way to exploring winter trails. There are two

classes and one field trip at Stevens Pass. Topics of instruction includes selection and use of proper equipment, conditioning, what to rent, where to go, how to plan and evaluate snowshoe routes to avoid avalanche risk, winter travel, safety, and choosing an outing.

This course is designed to teach the fundamental skills required to safely lead climb during the

Intro to Winter/Mixed Climbing | Jan 24 - Jan 29

winter months on routes consisting of rock and ice. Instruction includes use of ice tools and crampons on rock, proper selection and placement of protection, and anchor building and rappelling. Course graduates are eligible to participate in Intermediate Winter Climbs. The course consists of one day and one weekend field trip.

A bridge between hiking and technical mountaineering, alpine scrambling teaches students how to negotiate low angle rock, travel through talus and scree, cross streams, navigate dense forest

growth, and climb and cross snow-covered slopes. You will learn the skills necessary to reach the summits of most of the mountains in the Pacific Northwest. Basic Sea Kayaking | Mar 23 - Sep 23

This once-a-year offering provides you with a thorough and safe introduction into the great world of

sea kayaking. Learn the basic paddling strokes, how to get back in if capsize, trip planning, proper

and necessary equipment, and important safety guidelines and procedures. On top of all of this you'll meet a great bunch of new friends to paddle with during and after the class.



Nordic Ski Instructor Clinic | Jan 7 - Jan 29

Refresh your touring skills, while learning the student progression for Nordic skiing. These clinics cover student progression from fundamentals like balance, form, and rhythm to touring on groomed and ungroomed trails. Completion of this clinic qualifies you to register as an instructor for the Everett Branch Nordic Ski Course.

Basic Climbing Instructor Review | Jan 21 This review will take place at the Seattle Program Center. If you're a new instructor, feel like you

need to brush up on your skills, or haven't attended in the last few years, this review is a requirement to help instruct. It's a good way to get back in the climbing mindset before the course starts. **Trail Maintenance Crew Leader Class** | Mar 11
