

IT IS TIME TO VOTE! The Mountaineer Program Center has distributed an electronic ballot to the membership. Three important items are on it.

- 1. We will be electing the following **Branch Officers** for two year terms: Chair, Vice Chair, Secretary and Treasurer. The Branch Director will be elected to a three year term as provided by the Mountaineer ByLaws.
- 2. The membership will also be asked to review and approve the **2016 Amendments to the Branch Rules of Governance**. The Branch Executive Committee and all of the branch members, who attended a special meeting on September 7, recommended that the proposed Amendments be approved.
- 3. The membership will also be voting for five **At-Large Directors**. They represent the Mountaineer membership as a whole, whereas, Branch Directors represent each of the seven branches.


# Upcoming Events
