
Hi Everett Mountaineers,

Avalanche AIARE Level 1 | Dec 7 - Jan 8 Everyone who ventures into the mountains m

Everyone who ventures into the mountains must know about avalanches. Arm yourself with the knowledge and skills needed to safely travel in the mountains during the winter. The AIARE course introduces students to the factors which create avalanches such as weather, snowpack, human activity, and terrain. How to avoid avalanches will also be covered. The course includes a field trip to Mount Baker Jan 7-8. Students will simulate recovering an avalanche victim by finding beacons buried in the snow. It is a fun way to learn a critical skill.

Nordic (Cross Country) Ski | Jan 4 - Feb 4 Shed unwanted holiday pounds by taking our cross-country ski course. This course is

designed for the beginning student, but more experienced skiers are also welcome to join us to improve their techniques and make new skiing partners.

Backcountry Ski/Snowboard Intermediate downhill skiers who have grown tired of crowded parking lots, expensive

tickets, and long lift lines can away from them by going into the backcountry. Using skins to find acres of trackless powder.

Snowshoe Course

Alpine Scramble Course

A bridge between hiking and technical mountaineering, alpine scrambling teaches you how to negotiate low angle rock, travel through talus and scree, cross streams, navigate dense

to negotiate low angle rock, travel through talus and scree, cross streams, navigate dense forest growth, and walk on snow-covered slopes. You will learn how to reach non-technical summits while exploring the diverse off-trail landscape.
