- **Give Wildlife Space and be Careful!** In July, a group of kayakers were paddling in the Broughton Islands area off of Vancouver Island when they were attacked by a sea lion. Fortunately, their injuries were not major, but this does serve as a reminder that even though we are required to give wildlife space (100 yards for kayakers), wildlife may not follow the same rules. Be sure to pay attention to what's around you, and whenever possible, to move away from wildlife and give them space. Whatever you do, <u>don't be this guy</u>...
- **Mt Pilchuck Lookout Stewardship:** In July, Louie Coglas, along with a student from the climbing program, worked on the Mt Pilchuck lookout. They hauled up around 60lbs of tools and gear (each) and stayed overnight, enjoying the 4th of July fireworks show with about 20 other guests. Keep an eye on <u>Everett</u> <u>Mountaineers activities</u> for stewardship outings and other opportunities.
