
- Likely snow-free along the high trail by mid-late April in most years but may be blowdowns and winter trail damage. Some entry points like Hat Point may not be accessible yet.
- In early May it was quite warm by the river and the poison oak on the descent routes to the river was already shin-high, growing fast

Logistics Considerations

- Snowmelt timing in the early spring
- Poison oak explosion soon after snowmelt
- Heat by mid spring
- Ticks
- Bear cubs
- Need a tent that can withstand occasional high winds
- Road access to Freezeout Trailhead is well maintained
- A Northwest Forest Pass or Interagency Pass is required

This trail is for you if:

- You're not highly reactive to poison oak
- You love high panoramas and shoreline views (and a cool river dip!)
- You don't mind a few precipitous traverses
- You're looking for a great snow-free backpack before the high Cascades melt out
