  - Foothills Scrambling Basecamp

    - For centralized sharing and committee discussion
  - Course Inventory:
    - Compressed Alpine Scrambling 2021
      - 2020 Course had 25 student capacity
      - 13 students will roll over from 2020
      - Will post the course by 10/1 for registration starting 11/1
      - Discussion on challenges running course
        - Limits on carpooling
        - DNR permits slow—may need a backup location for rock (John)
        - Smaller instructor pool? (Madga).
          - Possibly, but we've historically had more instructor support than needed. We can evaluate instructor signups in December.
        - First-aid / Navigation as stumbling blocks (Nina)
          - Navigation running field trips in October. Will see how those go as a template for winter course.
          - Seattle First Aid committee removed the scenarios night requirement for 2020 first aid students. Not sure of plan for 2021. Not sure of RMI policies and availability.

- Scramble Leadership
  - Foothills leadership standards
  - Foothills mentor list
  - Ropes and anchors clinic
  - Action Item: Start discussions on Basecamp
  - Open discussion
    - Desirable for those pursuing leadership status to be able to work with a mentor from Foothills or Seattle (Magda)
    - Makes sense since the Foothills list previous WAS the Seattle list. The goal by having a Foothills list is to expand the pool of available mentors, not restrict it. (Travis)
    - Desirable to have flexibility in meeting the requirements for leader status. For example, instructing in Seattle's scrambling course could suffice for instructor experience for someone pursuing a Foothills leader badge (Magda).
- Foothills Scrambling Equivalency
  - Review min standards
  - Review Foothills standards
  - Action Item: Start discussion on Basecamp (Travis)
  - Open discussion
    - Equivalency tends to not work well as a "cookie cutter" approach.
      Usually needs to be tailored to the style and size of the branch (Travis).
    - Based on discussion with Danielle, equivalency has proven time and resource intensive, so it has typically not be emphasized (Travis).
    - Many of the Basic Climbing students that were cancelled due to covid would be candidates for scramble equivalency. Might see an uptick in applications (Stephen).
