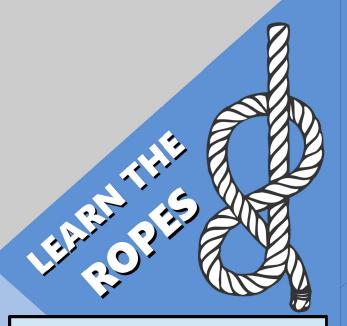
By the end of the program, climbers will be able to belay, rappel, self-arrest, safely travel on snow and glaciers, and be a part of a rope team, among other skills learned and practiced.

HONE YOUR

Under the supervision of more experienced climbers, we'll go on field trips to practice and evaluate you on the essentials.

We'll go to:

- Spire Rock and the Cirque rock gym to practice on rock
- Paradise to prep you for glacier travel
- Vantage to test your belay/rappel
- Mount Baker to test crevasse rescue



With a team of experienced volunteers from prior climbing courses, we'll teach you the essentials to get started.

We'll teach you:

- Essential knots and hitches
- How to spot hazardous terrain
- The gear needed for safe climbing
- The use of an ice ax on snow/ice
- The systems of belaying and rappelling

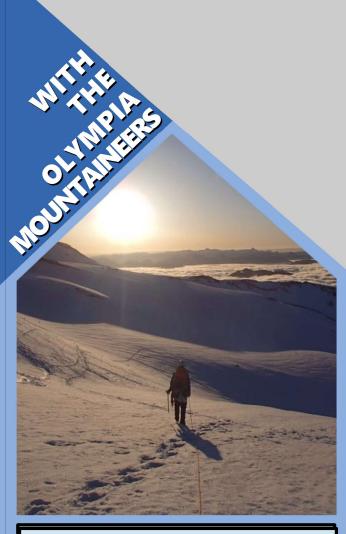
