All winter recreationists

Read the signs, know the rules Let faster parties pass Fix your falls—fill your divots Don't posthole – deep boot holes ruin ski and snowshoe trails Rest or water stop? Step off the trail Dogs—follow rules, leash, clean up poop Common sense, kindness and courtesy

Snowshoers

Yield to uphill snowshoers and all skiiers On shared trails, stay on snowshoe section, even if ungroomed Stay off the ski track and the middle skate area



Skiers

On a one-way trail, go in the right direction Yield the center/skate lane to skate and downhill skiers Try not to ski across tracks Keep the bottom of hills clear Stay on the right-hand side Pass on the left Call out when passing If you need to walk—stay far to the side

Leave no trace in the snow

Don't feed the animals

Pack it in, pack it out

Check around after lunch or snack stop

When nature calls...

- Let others know you need a "party separation"
- Pack it out-bag system or other
- Don't hide your pee
- Away from trail and water sources
