

## Seattle Hiking Committee - Steps to become a Hike Leader

- 1. Attend 2.5 hour hike leader seminar. Pre-requisites for the seminar are as follows:
  - Mountaineers member
  - New Mountaineers members who have not participated in any Mountaineers activities must participate in 3 club day hikes <u>before</u> attending the seminar.
  - Current members with a record of activities (e.g., scrambling, climbing) but no participation in day hikes may complete the 3 club day hikes after the Seminar, but before leading their mentored hike. These must be regular club day hikes led through a hiking committee by a hike leader. Conditioning hikes that are part of a course such as climbing or scrambling do not count towards this requirement.
  - Please note that urban hikes cannot be used to meet the day hike requirements in the preceding 2 bullets.
- 2. Read all resource materials on course activity page.
- 3. Complete the Low Impact Recreation Skills eLearning course
- 4. Complete <u>Hike leader application</u>.
- 5. Identify a mentor and request temporary hike leader status by sending an email to: SeattleHikeLeader@gmail.com
- 6. If you need assistance identifying a mentor, send an email to <a href="SeattleHikeLeader@gmail.com">SeattleHikeLeader@gmail.com</a> with the mentored hike you'd like to lead and the pace at which you intend to lead it with several potential dates.
- 7. Post and lead a mentored club day hike within 6 months of completing the hike leader seminar. The hike must meet the following criteria:
  - Hike must not be associated with a course
  - Hike may <u>not</u> be an urban hike or a night hike
  - Hike must be a minimum of 4-5 miles and 1000' elevation gain
  - Hike leader candidate must post the hike as the primary leader and register the mentor as the co-leader; hike should be posted under the Seattle Hiking Committee
  - Hike should be open to a minimum of 10 participants (8 hikers + 2 leaders)
  - Hike must have a minimum 10-day sign-up window
  - Hike should enable demonstration of the skills presented during the seminar.
- 8. Close the activity after completion.
- 9. Receive positive recommendation from mentor to be granted permanent hike leader status.
- 10. Seattle hiking committee will inform you that you've met the requirements to become a hike leader and ask you to confirm that you'd like to be added to the active leader roster.
- 11. If you do not have a current Wilderness First-Aid (WFA) or Mountaineering Oriented First-Aid (MOFA) badge, you must earn the badge or be signed up for a course within 1 year of earning your hike leader badge.

## **Mentor Requirements**

Mentor selected must be a current hike leader who has been a leader for a minimum of one year and has led a minimum of 6 club hikes as primary leader.
