Meeting Time and Location:	<p>Meet: at the Safeway in Cle Elum, I-90 Exit 84. Splitting into groups of 12 and staggering start times TBD</p> <p>Trailhead Pass: Drivers need a current "Northwest Forest Pass or equivalent.</p>
Outing Location:	<p>Bean and Earl Peaks, Bean Creek Basin (Tributary of North Fork of Teanaway Creek), Wenatchee National Forest, Kittitas County.</p>
Directions:	<p>Trailhead Directions:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. From I-90 exit 84, take State Hwy. 970 east for 7 miles to the Teanaway Road; turn left just before milepost 7; 2. Drive 13 miles from Hwy 970 to Twenty-Nine Pines Campground; 3. At Twenty-Nine Pines Campground continue north, bearing right onto US Forest Rd. 9737 toward Beverly Creek Campground (4 miles); 4. After about 3.5 miles, turn right at Beverly Creek Road to Trail 1391.
Prerequisites:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Attend lectures #1-#4. ▪ Attend all previous field trips ▪ Pass a conditioner hike (you will not be allowed on the overnight without successfully passing a conditioner hike).

EQUIPMENT	
Required:	<p>Basic Scrambles Gear with Overnight Pack and Gear See Equipment List pg. 11 of Student Guide</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Ice axe, with leash and adze taped with duct tape - * <u>Mountaineering</u> boots* See Lecture 1 Pg 8 - Meals/snacks for two days - Blue bag system
Recommended:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Trekking poles ▪ Sleeping bag should be rated at 20°F or lower ▪ Coordinate tent partners and share gear responsibility ▪ Coordinate meals in groups of 2-3 <u>before</u> the trip: <i>1 breakfast and 1 supper</i> ▪ Carpooling – this is a long trip to the eastern side of the Cascade Mountains
Special Note:	<p>Shared gear (tents, stoves, fuel, filters, shovels, etc.) will be discussed in class prior to the field trip.</p> <p>Plan to camp on snow and have fun, fun, fun!</p> <p>Those not adequately equipped will NOT be allowed to participate</p>

**We strongly recommend a set of dry clothing in the car to change into afterwards. **
